# *Miss Coarsegold Rodeo Queen 2012*

## **RULES AND INFORMATION**

**The contest is Friday, May 4, 2012 at 1:30pm. RAIN OR SHINE!**

1. The Queen competition is limited to single (never married) women ages **17-24 years old as of January 1, 2012**. The 2012 Coarsegold Rodeo Queen will receive a crown, sash, silver buckle, and a **trophy saddle (if there are 5 or more queen contestants)**.
2. There will be a **MANDATORY meeting on March 3, 2012 at 1PM** at the \*Coarsegold Historical Society Museum. Details describing the competition, judging, advertisement sales and schedule of events will be explained. **Contestants are also to submit a photograph for publication**. A group photograph will be taken. If you don't have an individual photograph for publication, we will be happy to take one for you after the group photos have been taken. Dress in appropriate casual western wear; long sleeve shirt, jeans, boots and western hat.
3. **Entries close on Saturday, March 3, 2012 @ 1PM**. All entries must be hand delivered. If you, as a contestant, are unable to be at this meeting, you may, with permission, send a representative to deliver your entry forms. You will then be subject to meeting with the Royalty Coordinator within 10 days.
4. Each contestant must **provide her own horse** and must use the same horse for the entire competition. **No stallions will be permitted**.
5. The contestants will be judged on the following:
  - A. Equitation:** Contestants will enter the arena on the rail. The judges will ask contestants to walk, jog, and lope their horses in both directions and line up. The judges will approach each contestant and inspect her horse and tack for cleanliness and grooming and ask each contestant to back her horse.
  - B. Horsemanship:** This is an event where the horse is judged on quality of gaits, lead changes at the lope, response to the rider, manners, and disposition. The horse should perform with reasonable speed, and be sensible, well-mannered, free and easy moving. Contestants will enter the arena individually and perform the pattern. The pattern will be available at noon meeting, day of the contest
  - C. Reining:** To rein a horse is not only to guide him, but also to control his every movement. The best reined horse should be willfully guided or controlled with little or no apparent resistance and dictated to completely. All deviations from the exact written pattern must be considered a lack of or temporary loss of control, and therefore faulted according to severity of deviation. Each contestant will enter the arena individually and perform the designated reining pattern. All horses will be judged immediately upon entering the arena and judging will cease after the last maneuver. Any fault incurred prior to the commencement of a pattern will be scored accordingly. The pattern will be available at noon meeting, day of the contest. The scoring for reining will be explained at the March 6th meeting.
  - D. Salute:** Each contestant will enter the arena individually, gallop around the arena performing a wave or salute.
  - E. Interviews:** Each contestant will individually be asked a series of questions one on one with the judges, additionally each contestant will go up on stage and will be asked a series of questions by the judges.
  - F. Appearance and Personality:** Each contestant will be ranked by the judges on their Appearance and Personality.
  - G. Raffle and Ad Sales:** Each contestant shall also be ranked on their raffle and ad sales. This will only compromise a very small portion of the overall score.

6. Only humane bits and tack, as defined by USEF rules, will be allowed during the entire competition and Coarsegold Rodeo related events. Any rules and/or regulations not specifically addressed in the Coarsegold Rodeo Queen Contest Rules and Regulations will be according to the USEF rules and regulations.

7. The Coarsegold Rodeo reserves the right to cancel the contest or extend the deadline, if less than three entrants submit applications for the Miss Coarsegold Rodeo Queen competition.

8. Attire: Jeans or slacks of any color, long sleeved western shirt, blouse, jacket, etc., western boots, western hat. Gloves and chaps are optional. A skirt or dress may be worn for interview. **Overall presentation is important!**

9. Harassment of the judges, committee members or other contestants by a contestant, her family or supporters or **UNSPORTSMANLIKE CONDUCT WILL RESULT IN IMMEDIATE DISQUALIFICATION**. This rule will be in effect prior to, during, and after the Rodeo. If a circumstance occurs, it will be reviewed by the Rodeo Committee, who will then decide the ramifications. Disciplinary action can include forfeiture of the crown, inability to compete in future competitions, etc.

10. There will be a **meeting prior to the competition on Friday, May 4th at noon** at the Coarsegold Rodeo Grounds. At this time contestants will be issued their numbers and the schedule of events for the day will be explained. At 1pm parents, guardians, trainers and anyone associated with contestants will be asked to take a seat in the grandstands. During the riding events, only contestants and Rodeo Committee members will be allowed in arena areas. **Once the competition begins, there will be no coaching, training, or contact from outside the arena (by parents, friends, trainers, etc.). THIS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED!** Failure to comply is grounds for disqualification of contestant.

11. Each contestant is required to sell \$300 worth of advertising. The money for these ads is to be turned in **by 5pm Monday April 16, 2012**. Ads can be mailed to Laura Norman at PO Box 984, Oakhurst, CA 93644 or e-mailed to [ads@thecoarsegoldrodeo.com](mailto:ads@thecoarsegoldrodeo.com). All contestants are urged to sell beyond the required amount as there will be a **special prize for the contestant selling the most ads**. All contestants will be required to spend time in the Rodeo Promotion Booth during the Rodeo Weekend.

12. Each contestant is required to sell \$300 worth of raffle tickets. All Raffle tickets must be turned in by May 4<sup>th</sup> at Noon. There are cash incentives for additional raffle sales,

13. All contestants are required to participate in the Saturday Pro Rodeo from noon until approximately 4pm, and the Sunday Pro Rodeo at 10:30am. The contest is on a Friday. If anyone feels their schools will not allow them to participate please let us know ASAP and we will send a letter stating the pro side of this type of competition in the education of a young lady. On Sunday, please check in at the Rodeo Promotion Booth by 10am

14. The results of the contest and the crowning of the **Miss Coarsegold Rodeo Queen 2012** will be **Sunday, May 6, 2012** at noon.

15. You are all winners and should be proud of participating in the Miss Coarsegold Rodeo Queen 2012 contest. **GOOD LUCK TO ALL OF YOU!**
